Co-creating Scripts for Young Children



If you've ever kept a journal, you know that expressing your feelings in writing can be therapeutic. Young children can also experience emotional validation, self-expression, and relief through writing. When children see their words printed and listen as their teacher reads them aloud, their language and emotions have power and meaning. Preschool teachers have long known the benefits of taking child dictations. Co-creating scripts is a similar process, but the teacher takes a more active role. The teacher offers to help the child solve a problem by writing down his words and ideas. A teacher asking a sad child if he would like to write a letter to his mom (whom he is really missing) is a perfect example of co-creating a script.

Charlie's Red Glove

Charlie, a bright and sensitive preschooler, had difficulty with Transitions and often found the busy classroom overwhelming. He sought quiet places and sedentary play. Today Charlie was sobbing; he had lost one of his red gloves. All of the teachers tried to console and comfort him. They helped him

search for the missing glove and suggested that perhaps his mom had accidentally taken it with her. Nothing seemed to help. Charlie had one glove on, and the other was missing. He refused to borrow from the mitten basket. He wouldn't budge from his cubby. I sat down on the floor next to Charlie's cubby with my clipboard, trying to decide how I might help.

A few days earlier, when he'd had a hard time separating from his mom, we had co-created a letter. With each sentence dictated and reread, I could see him released from his stress. When we had finished the letter, Charlie had folded it up in the crumpled way 3-year-olds fold paper, stuffed it in his backpack, and moved into the classroom to play.

On this day I engaged Charlie again. I asked simple yes and no questions that I felt would validate his longing for his missing glove. "Charlie, was your glove red?" Charlie nodded. "Here is a red marker. Charlie, I want to draw a picture of your red glove so that I can remember what it looks like." Another nod. "Can I see your other glove? I can trace it and make a picture of your missing glove." As I carefully traced the glove, Charlie stopped crying and watched me color in each finger with the red marker. We sat quietly together while I worked on my clipboard, which was tipped in Charlie's direction. Although I colored in silence, I tried to involve Charlie by moving the marker slowly and watching his response.

What is Preschool Open Doors?

Preschool Open Doors (POD) is a statewide early childhood education and care project funded by the State of Hawaii Department of Human Services, administered by PATCH. **Preschool Open Doors helps children go to preschool by helping families to pay preschool costs for one year. Any licensed preschool may accept POD children.**

POD understands the importance of every child having the opportunity for a positive early learning experience. Preschool prepares children for kindergarten by teaching social skills and recognition of shapes and letters. It allows children to explore and discover their world in a learning environment. Children also learn how to get along with others and to work as part of a group.

How Much of My Child's Preschool Expenses Will POD Pay?

Preschool Open Doors has sliding fee scales, based upon State of Hawaii child care assistance guidelines. Depending on family size and income, families may be required to pay some of the monthly preschool costs.

You will receive notification by mail if your child is accepted for the current school year.

How Can My Family Qualify for Preschool Open Doors Funding?

To qualify for POD, your family must meet the following requirements:

1. Special Needs Four-Year Olds
First priority will be given to four-year* old children from a Special Populations Referral, (e.g. children who are homeless, have limited English or developmental delays and those with physical or mental impairments who are not enrolled by Dept. of Education for preschool).
2. Age of Child
Second priority will be children who will be *four-years old by 12/31/2011.
3. Special Needs Three-Year Olds
Some three-year old children from special populations may qualify if funds available.
4. Family Income
Your family's gross monthly income (before taxes and deductions) must be within allowable income limits. If your gross monthly income is less than the amount listed for your family size, you may be eligible for POD funding.

For families of 6 or more, please contact Preschool Open Doors Office for limits.

Cut-Off Date for Applications?

POD funds are limited. Applications are accepted during the open enrollment period of March 1 - April 30 of each year, for the school year that starts the following August.

Co-creating Scripts for Young Children

The coloring itself gave us a peaceful shared moment and a certain distraction from the previous stress. Next, I said, "I have an idea. Sometimes when people lose something, they make a sign for everyone to read. Would you like to help me write a sign about your glove? We can hang it on the door. If someone finds the glove, they will know it is yours." Charlie looked at me and said, "Yes!" After writing the note with Charlie, I read his words back to him several times. When he agreed that the sign was done, we taped it to the classroom door and he ran outside gloveless to enjoy the last 10 minutes of playtime. A few days later we all enjoyed a giant class cheer when the missing glove turned up in a playmate's backpack. This life experience let Charlie know that he could cope with difficult emotions. Through an emergent literacy activity as simple as making a sign, Charlie had a real-life lesson that supported his emotional life, contributed to a responsive and caring classroom, and demonstrated the power of language.

Tips for Co-creating Scripts

Grab your clipboard and stay close to the child. The first few times it may feel a bit awkward and unnatural for you and the child. Comfort and ease will grow as you build a reflective community that solves problems by writing them down.

Ask a question or use a simple phrase or other prompt if the child needs support verbalizing: "Maybe we could make a list of things you are worried about." "I wonder what you want to say next."



Act as a coach, but let the child talk. Ask open-ended questions, and invite the child to respond. Don't speak for the child or assume you know what the child is thinking or feeling. The adult's role is to write the child's words exactly as he or she speaks them, while acting as a coach by making suggestions. ("Do you want to write a letter/ make a sign/develop a list?")

Read the sentences or words back to the child several times. Rereading the child's words and phrases is a wonderful validation tool. This is also an important step in helping the child slow down, breathe, listen, and reflect.

Create a "Let's write that down" atmosphere in your classroom. When a child makes a suggestion about which story he wants to read at group time, you can say, "That's a great idea. Let me write that down so I remember it." When a child is crying because she didn't get a turn with the magnets at the science center, you can say, "I'm going to write a note that Amanda wants a turn with the magnets."

What could be more meaningful and tangible in the life of a young child than writing about an emotionally charged event? Co-creating scripts with children is a dual-purpose strategy. It responds to children's strong emotions while also creating a literacy experience. Experiencing and expressing strong emotions is new and sometimes frightening for children. When adults respond with care, children can develop healthy attitudes about themselves as individuals and as members of a group.

10 Ways to Involve Children in Their Community

What is the difference between adults who are helpers in the community and those who never volunteer to help those less fortunate? The answer often lies in what they were taught as children. Children who learn that helping others makes the community a better place for everyone usually commit themselves to a lifetime of community service. Just think about the impact your children can make in their community and the world! The following suggestions are easy to incorporate into your program and are sure to plant the seeds of community activism:

1. Draw a Welcome Mural. Welcome visitors to your program by hanging a colorful mural in your lobby. To begin, use a large sheet of butcher roll paper and tape to the floor. At the top of the paper write, "Welcome to _____". Then invite the children to decorate. Make sure you provide the children with different colors of paint, markers, crayons, glue, and collage materials.

2. Plant a Flowerbed at Your Entrance. Nothing says, "Welcome" like a bed or border of well-tended flowers and plants. Before purchasing any plants, however, check with your local greenhouse for a list of plants that are easy for children to care for and grow well in your area. The children will have a great sense of pride in not only planting the flowers, but also caring for them as they grow into beautiful flowering plants.

3. Support Your Local Humane Shelter. Organize a "Help Our Animal Friends" drive by encouraging the parents in your program and members of your community to donate pet food, supplies, and toys. After the items have been gathered,



take the class on a field trip to deliver the supplies. The children will love seeing the animals, and the shelter will greatly appreciate your donation. In addition, encourage your parents to check with your local shelter prior to purchasing an animal from a pet store and teach responsible pet care by educating them on appropriate pets for young children.

4. Design Your Own Greeting Cards. Send a letter home to parents asking them to save and bring in used greeting cards. After you've collected enough cards, have the children cut away the pictures and verses. Then paste onto colorful construction paper to make new cards. Help the children write a special message on their card. Deliver the cards to a nearby nursing home or residential care facility.

5. Collect Non-perishable Food Items. Homeless shelters need non-perishable food items during the entire year, not just during the holiday season. Encourage the children to participate in a food drive by asking members of the community and local businesses to donate basic food items such as rice, dry beans, canned foods, flour, and sugar.

6. Create a Special Trash Can. Teach children the importance of depositing litter in appropriate places by creating a trash can mascot for the classroom. Draw facial features on the trash can and create a contest to give the can a name. Place a container indoors and one on the playground. You'll be surprised at the enthusiasm children will show for taking out the trash! This is a great idea to share with parents as well.

7. Collect Second-hand Women's Purses. Fill the purses with samples of soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrush, and other toilet items. Then deliver to a women's shelter.

8. Bank for a Cause. Each month, set aside a glass jar or piggy bank for the children to fill with pennies, nickels, and dimes. Select a community project or fundraiser, such as a person needing a rare or expensive surgery or a family whose house was destroyed by fire, to receive the funds.

10. Include Character Building Activities in Your Curriculum. Use every opportunity to teach children responsibility, integrity, honesty, loyalty, and faithfulness. Talk to the children about the value of friendship and why it is important to help others. Connect your parents to school activities by sending home parent newsletters with character-building activities.

Reminders About Training Attendance

Thank you for your diligence as a child care professional and for your dedication in your on-going training and development.

When attending PATCH training classes there are a few guidelines to remember:

Sign Up for Classes Ahead of Time:

Please remember to sign up for PATCH classes at least 48 hours in advance, by calling your local PATCH office. This determines enrollment numbers and provides PATCH with your contact information in case the class is rescheduled/cancelled due to low enrollment or emergencies. It also gives us time to prepare materials for classes.

Remember to sign in: You will not receive a certificate for a training class if your name does not appear on the sign-in sheet. Please check all information on the sign-in sheet. Print clearly when correcting any errors in your name, address, or telephone number.

Be on time: If you arrive more than 15 minutes late, you will not be allowed to sign in. If you are unable to stay for the full duration of the training, you will not receive a training certificate. In both circumstances, your attendance will not be posted in the database for that class.

Likewise, if a trainer is more than 15 minutes late— you may assume that the class has been cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances. We will call you to reschedule the class.

Turn off your cell phone: As a courtesy to other participants, please turn off the volume of your cell phone or pager.

Adults only please: We love children, but as a courtesy to other participants, we ask that you make alternative arrangements for child care.

Bring your Record of Training:

Please bring your Record of Training (available via the PATCH office) with you to each class and remember to get the instructor's signature after each class. When you have completed an entire series, return the original Record of Training to the PATCH office and we will mail you a Certificate of Completion for the series.

Keep good records: Whether you take a PATCH class or any other training, you should keep track of the trainings you attend for future reference. If you need verification of your PATCH classes, there is a \$2.00 fee for a computer printout list of classes taken at PATCH. If you have misplaced your Record of Training sheet, there is a \$3.00 fee for a replacement. Duplicate certificates are available for \$1.00 each. Please keep in mind that PATCH often deletes information beyond 5 years to make room for the next year.

The PATCH Training Calendar has been designed for easy reading. Each class has indicators that are related to Hawaii's **Attitudes, Skills and Knowledge (ASK)** Core Areas and the **Subject Areas (SA)** for the Child Development Associate (CDA).

New and Improved!

Basic Series (10 classes)

- An overview of basic skills to become a successful family child care provider.

Challenging Behaviors Basic Series

(7 classes) - This series is for experienced caregivers looking to gain in-depth knowledge and strategies for working with children (ages 2-8) who have challenging behaviors.

Quality Care Series (10 classes) - The workshops in this new series are designed to support staff in early childhood programs as they engage in the self-assessment process for the Hawaii Preschool Content Standards incentive of the Quality Care Program. Also meets professional development for early educators.
