Five Things to do Outdoors with Children

What are some of your fondest childhood memories? Chances are, some of your fond memories involve nature. But today, with so many activities vying for children's attention — from soccer practice to computer games to television — it's easy to forget that simple activities, like a walk in the park, can be just as rewarding.

The fact is, communing with nature is the perfect hands-on activity. It's educational, entertaining, and economical. And it isn't just for budding biologists either. Nature can provide a foundation for many subjects. An ancient tree might spark the imagination of a future historian. Petals on a flower can give a little mathematician something to count. And a rainbow can stir the soul of a young artist.

Convinced? Okay then, get outdoors! Here are five easy nature activities to get you started.

1. **Make a Leaf Mask.** Some animals such as toads and grasshoppers wear colors that help them blend into their habitats. By wearing a leaf mask, children can blend in too. First, take a nature walk to collect some fallen leaves. Next, draw the outline of a mask on cardboard. Almost any shape will work as long as you draw holes for eyes. Cut out the eyes, then let the children cut out the mask. Punch holes in the sides of the mask. Thread a piece of string through each hole and knot. Have the children glue leaves onto the mask with white craft glue. Let the glue dry completely before tying the mask on a child's head.
2. **Go on a Seed Safari.** Seeds are baby plants just waiting for the right environment to grow. They cannot move around on their own so they often hitch rides on people and passing animals. These sneaky hitchhikers can be caught by dragging an old pair of pantyhose or wearing an old pair of socks over shoes while walking through the woods. Both methods will pick up seeds the children can bring back to the center for planting.

Eco-Healthy Child Care



Help has arrived for child care providers and parents who want to choose environments that are safe, healthy, and free of chemicals of

concern. The Eco-Healthy Child Care (EHCC) program, now available in more than 1,300 locations across the US, Canada and Australia, ensures that child care settings are as environmentally healthy as possible.

Child care facilities qualify as “Eco-Healthy” by completing a checklist that highlights 30 simple steps which ensure a safe place for children. Eco-Healthy providers commit to reducing

children’s exposure to toxic materials and environmental health hazards.

Qualifying facilities receive an endorsement certificate and a poster that lets parents and others know of their efforts, and demonstrates their commitment to being Eco-Healthy. Endorsed programs are also listed on the EHCC website.

EHCC received the *Children’s Environmental Health Excellence Award* in 2006 from the EPA for its innovative and effective approach. EHCC also recently received the *2009-2010 Childcare and School IPM Recognition Award* from the IPM Institute of North America, Inc.

3. **Bury a Treasure.** Encourage the children to draw a treasure map to represent the child care center. Include landmarks such as playgrounds, fences, trees, bushes, etc. Next, plant a variety of spring-flowering bulbs such as crocuses, tulips, or daffodils in different spots around the center. As each bulb gets planted, the children mark its place on the map with an X. Cut out pictures of the flowers from the bulb packages and glue them onto the map as a key.
4. **Be a Cloud Watcher.** Spend an afternoon watching clouds morph into animals and other shapes. Bring along a pad of paper, crayons, glue, and a bag of cotton balls. Encourage the children to draw the shapes they see, then glue cotton balls onto the drawing to look like clouds.



5. **Measure It With Sticks.** Long ago, before rulers with inches and centimeters, people used all sorts of things for measuring. People used objects from nature, such as sticks and stones. Encourage the children to find their own natural ruler and use it to measure several objects. How many leaves high is the art table? How many sticks long is the toddler room?

Reminders About Training Attendance

Thank you for your diligence as a child care professional and for your dedication in your on-going training and development.

When attending PATCH training classes there are a few guidelines to remember:

Sign Up for Classes Ahead of Time:

Please remember to sign up for PATCH classes at least 48 hours in advance, by calling your local PATCH office. This determines enrollment numbers and provides PATCH with your contact information in case the class is rescheduled/cancelled due to low enrollment or emergencies. It also gives us time to prepare materials for classes.

Remember to sign in: You will not receive a certificate for a training class if your name does not appear on the sign-in sheet. Please check all information on the sign-in sheet. Print clearly when correcting any errors in your name, address, or telephone number.

Be on time: If you arrive more than 15 minutes late, you will not be allowed to sign in. If you are unable to stay for the full duration of the training, you will not receive a training certificate. In both circumstances, your attendance will not be posted in the database for that class.

Likewise, if a trainer is more than 15 minutes late— you may assume that the class has been cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances. We will call you to reschedule the class.

Turn off your cell phone: As a courtesy to other participants, please turn off the volume of your cell phone or pager.

Adults only please: We love children, but as a courtesy to other participants, we ask that you make alternative arrangements for child care.

Bring your Record of Training:

Please bring your Record of Training (available via the PATCH office) with you to each class and remember to get the instructor's signature after each class. When you have completed an entire series, return the original Record of Training to the PATCH office and we will mail you a Certificate of Completion for the series.

Keep good records: Whether you take a PATCH class or any other training, you should keep track of the trainings you attend for future reference. If you need verification of your PATCH classes, there is a \$2.00 fee for a computer printout list of classes taken at PATCH. If you have misplaced your Record of Training sheet, there is a \$3.00 fee for a replacement. Duplicate certificates are available for \$1.00 each. Please keep in mind that PATCH often deletes information beyond 5 years to make room for the next year.

How to Read the PATCH Training Calendar

The PATCH Training Calendar has been designed for easy reading. Each class has indicators that are related to Hawaii's **Attitudes, Skills and Knowledge (ASK)** Core Areas and the **Subject Areas (SA)** for the Child Development Associate (CDA).

New and Improved!

Basic Series (10 classes)

- An overview of basic skills to become a successful family child care provider.

Challenging Behaviors Basic Series

(7 classes) - This series is for experienced caregivers looking to gain in-depth knowledge and strategies for working with children (ages 2-8) who have challenging behaviors.

Quality Care Series (10 classes) - The workshops in this new series are designed to support staff in early childhood programs as they engage in the self-assessment process for the Hawaii Preschool Content Standards incentive of the Quality Care Program. Also meets professional development for early educators.

Puppet Series (5 classes) - For all early childhood professionals who are interested in using puppets to build literacy skills.

Supporting Play Series (5 classes) - Looks at methods early childhood professionals can utilize to help children (3-5 yrs.) develop socially and cognitively through play.

WestEd Basic Infant/Toddler Series (10 classes) - Introductory series to working with children age 0-3 yrs. (meets I/T licensing requirements).

WestEd Advanced Infant/Toddler Series (10 classes) - Focuses on additional considerations when working with children 0-3 yrs. (meets I/T licensing requirements).

Introduction to Preschool Series (7 classes) - This series is for new preschool staff and will provide an overview of working with preschool-aged children in centers or homes.

Infant/Toddler Series 3 (10 classes) - This series will continue to build on the foundations laid in the West Ed Basic and Advanced series for Infant and Toddlers. Meets DHS requirements for the 30 hours of maintaining Infant/Toddler professional development training.

There are **8 Subject Areas** utilized for the Child Development Associate (CDA). These indicators are important when looking for specific types of classes to fulfill initial CDA requirements :

- SA 1 - Planning a safe, healthy learning environment
- SA 2 - Steps to advance children's physical and intellectual development
- SA 3 - Positive ways to support children's social and emotional development
- SA 4 - Strategies to establish productive relationships with families

- SA 6 - Maintaining a commitment to profession
- SA 7 - Observing and recording children's behavior
