## Promoting Healthy Eating

Feeding children in your child care setting happens every day. Early food and eating experiences form the basis of how children think about food and eating behaviors. Are the foods you feed the children nutritious? Are you teaching and modeling healthy eating habits that will last a lifetime?

Overweight or obese children are at risk for many health problems. Some negative health outcomes that may be more obvious to children and their parents are asthma, sleep apnea, skin infections, and joint pain. These are all important health problems and need a doctor's attention. Less obvious serious health risks that are associated with obesity are high blood pressure (hypertension) and Type 2 Diabetes. The bottom line is obesity can cause health problems now as well as a number of very serious chronic health conditions in the future.

In the past 20 years, the amount of children who are obese has doubled, while obese adolescent number have tripled. In 2010, Preventing Childhood Obesity in Early Care and Education Programs standards were released for best practice in early education and child care settings for nutrition, physical activity, and screen time. Caregivers can develop practices, policies, and staff training to ensure their programs include healthy, age-appropriate feeding, plenty of physical activity, and limited screen time. Highlights of these national standards, from Caring for Our Children, 3rd edition, follow:



### 1. Use of USDA – CACFP Guidelines:

- ◆ All meals and snacks and their preparation, service and storage should meet the requirements for the meals of the child care component of the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP).

*RATIONALE:* A child's diet should be based on a variety of nutritious foods which provide substantial amounts of essential nutrients - protein, carbohydrates, oils, and vitamins and minerals - with appropriate calories to meet the child's needs. Early education and child care providers should use information on the child's growth in developing individual feeding plans. # Attention: Parents of 4 Year Olds\* Announcing Open Enrollment Period for Preschool Open Doors!

## What is Preschool Open Doors?

Preschool Open Doors (POD) is a statewide early childhood education and care project funded by the State of Hawaii Department of Human Services, administered by PATCH. **Preschool Open Doors helps children go to preschool by helping families to pay preschool costs for one year. Any licensed preschool may accept POD children.** POD understands the importance of every child having the opportunity for a positive early learning experience. Preschool prepares children for kindergarten by teaching social skills and recognition of shapes and letters. It allows children to explore and discover their world in a learning environment. Children also learn how to get along with others and to work as part of a group.

## How Much of My Child's Preschool Expenses Will POD Pay?

Preschool Open Doors has sliding fee scales, based upon State of Hawaii child care assistance guidelines. Depending on family size and income, families may be required to pay some of the monthly preschool costs.

You will receive notification by mail if your child is accepted for the current school year.

## How Can My Family Qualify for Preschool Open Doors Funding?

To qualify for POD, your family must meet the following requirements:

1. **Special Needs Four-Year Olds**  
First priority will be given to four-year\* old children from a Special Populations Referral, (e.g. children who are homeless, have limited English or developmental delays and those with physical or mental impairments who are not enrolled by Dept. of Education for preschool).
2. **Age of Child**  
Second priority will be children who will be \*four-years old by 12/31/2011.
3. **Special Needs Three-Year Olds**  
Some three-year old children from special populations may qualify if funds available.
4. **Family Income**  
Your family's gross monthly income (before taxes and deductions) must be within allowable income limits. If your gross monthly income is less than the amount listed for your family size, you may be eligible for POD funding.

## Cut-Off Date for Applications?

POD funds are limited. Applications are accepted during the open enrollment period of March 1 - April 30 of each year, for the school year that starts the following August.

## Free QUEST and QExA Health Insurance Available for Children and Youths

A family of four can earn around \$76,000 annually and their children may qualify for free QUEST or QExA health insurance programs. Children's eligibility is based on family size and income, and on citizenship or immigration status. Household assets, including homes and cars, are **not** counted for children to qualify.



Parents and guardians can call 211 (FREE phone call from all islands) to talk to a live operator who can mail the application and link them to an outreach worker for assistance with eligibility questions and paperwork. ## Now Available in Hawaii: LifeBridge<sup>SM</sup> FREE Life Insurance program for Families:

FREE life insurance for low-income working parents is now available in Hawaii!

Sponsored by Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company, LifeBridge is giving away \$1 billion of \$50,000 life insurance policies, and there are over 9,000 policies still available nationwide. Eligible Hawaii families should **APPLY NOW** for this program.

Each LifeBridge \$50,000 policy – one per household – has a 10-year term and must list the insured's child or children as the beneficiaries. In the event that an insured parent or legal guardian passes away during the term of the policy, \$50,000 would be paid into a trust and used exclusively toward the educational expenses of his or her eligible children.

When you hear FREE, you may be hesitant. Everything related to this program is FREE, provided you meet the eligibility factors at the time of application. This program is designed to help you protect your dream of providing an education for your children if you die before they complete their schooling.

Children have 10 years or until age 35, whichever is later, to use the \$50,000 educational benefit which is paid directly to the educational institution for expenses such as tuition, books, room and board. Various types of schools qualify including preschools, private schools, vocational schools, community colleges, universities, etc.

If you think you may qualify, please call to find out!

### Are you Eligible?

**You are eligible to apply for the LifeBridge program if you are:**

- ◆ Between the ages of 19 and 42;
- ◆ A parent or legal guardian of a dependent child under age 18;
- ◆ A permanent, legal resident of the United States;
- ◆ Currently employed, full or part time, with a total annual family income not less than \$10,000, or more than \$40,000 (not including COLA for Military);
- ◆ The only member of your household who has applied for the LifeBridge Free Life Insurance Program; and
- ◆ In good health as determined by MassMutual's underwriting guidelines.

### You would not be eligible if you:

- ◆ Have been diagnosed with heart disease, cancer, HIV or Type 1 Diabetes;
- ◆ Currently abuse drugs or alcohol or have abused them within the last 10 years; or
- ◆ Are currently on probation.

Hawaii's children need a voice at the legislature. Child advocates are no longer enough. Recently, legislators told us, "We keep seeing the same small group of advocates fighting for children's issues. If these issues are so important, where is everyone else? We need to hear the other voices."

We need your voice to strengthen the cause and to prove to our policymakers that children's issues are important to all of Hawaii.

In response to our legislators' surprising comments, Good Beginnings Alliance created a grassroots movement called Be My Voice Hawaii. Be My Voice Hawaii seeks to send a strong message that everyone cares about children's issues. The health, safety, and readiness of our children are imperative in assuring they become successful, thriving adults. Why does this matter? The outcome, whether they succeed or fail, will affect everyone's quality of life.

Over the past year, the State of Hawaii significantly cut the safety net of services and programs to young children and their families that were built up over the past 20 years. The reason: economic

downturn. Yet at the time, Hawaii was dedicating less than 3% of its resources to young children and their families.

How can we stand by and allow this to happen when we know for a fact:

- 85% of brain development happens before the age of 5;
- Quality prenatal and early childhood home visiting services for high-risk families can prevent child abuse and neglect, and promote positive child development;
- Adverse early childhood experiences have devastating effects on adult health, social relationships, and ability to hold jobs;
- Studies show that children who attend high quality early learning programs are more likely to graduate from high school and continue into college, and less likely to need public assistance as adults.

We need at least 5,000 names to make an impression. We're hoping for 10,000. Can you help? Do you know anyone else who cares about children and believes their health, safety, and readiness should be a priority with our policymakers? Urge them to sign, too.

Be My Voice Hawaii is about ensuring the health, safety, and readiness of our children – all of our children. We must prove to our legislators that we care.

## Healthy Child Care Hawaii

*Improving the Health & Safety of Hawaii's Keiki*

Healthy eating and activity habits should start early in life. There is a national effort to prevent obesity. Physical activity and healthy eating habits at an early age can make a difference.

### Healthy Eating Habits:

- \* Be a good role model.
- \* Offer a variety of foods.
- \* Help them try new foods and start with small portions.
- \* Make mealtime a family time.
- \* Make food fun.

### How to Encourage Your Child to Keep Active:

- \* Be a good role model.
- \* Make physical activity a part of your family's daily routine.
- \* Take them to places where they can be active, such as parks.
- \* Give them equipment that encourages physical activity, such as balls.
- \* 60 minutes or more of active, vigorous activity each day.

### 2. Limiting Fruit Juice Standard:

- ◆ Serve full-strength (100%) fruit juice or full-strength diluted with water from a cup to children twelve months of age or older.
- ◆ Juice should have no added sweeteners.
- ◆ Offer juice at specific meals and snacks instead of continuously throughout the day.
- ◆ No more than a total of four to six ounces a day of juice for children aged one to six years.
- ◆ No more than a total of eight to twelve ounces of fruit juice per day for children ages seven through twelve years of age.
- ◆ Caregivers/teachers should ask parents/guardians if they provide juice at home and how much.
- ◆ Infants should not be given any fruit juice before twelve months of age. Whole fruit, mashed or pureed, is recommended for infants seven months up to one year of age.

*RATIONALE:* Whole fruit is more nutritious than fruit juice and provides dietary fiber. Fruit juice which is 100% offers no nutritional advantage over whole fruits. Limiting the feeding of juice to specific meals and snacks will reduce acids produced by bacteria in the mouth that cause tooth decay.

### 3. Socialization at Meals Standard:

- ◆ Caregivers/teachers and children should sit at the table and eat the meal or snack together.

- ◆ Family style meal service, with the serving platters, bowls, and pitchers on the table so all children can serve themselves except for infants and very young children who require an adult to feed them.
- ◆ A separate utensil should be used for serving.
- ◆ Children should not handle foods that they will not be consuming.
- ◆ The adults should encourage, but not force, the children to help themselves to all food components offered at the meal.
- ◆ When eating meals with children, the adult(s) should eat items that meet nutrition standards.
- ◆ Adults should encourage children to socialize, using vocabulary related to concepts of color, shape, size, quantity, number, temperature of food, and events of the day.
- ◆ Extra assistance and time should be provided for slow eaters. Eating should be an enjoyable experience at the facility and at home.
- ◆ Special accommodations should be made for children who cannot have the food that is being served.
- ◆ Children who need limited portion sizes should be taught and monitored.

*RATIONALE:* "Family style" meal service promotes and supports social, emotional, and gross and fine motor skill development. Sitting and eating with children is an opportunity for children to practice social skills and for positive role-modeling by the adult caregiver. Table conversation makes the meal a lot more enjoyable and provides a chance to model positive eating behaviors, talking about eating and teaching good nutrition.

## Reminders About Training Attendance

**T**hank you for your diligence as a child care professional and for your dedication in your on-going training and development.

When attending PATCH training classes there are a few guidelines to remember:

### **Sign Up for Classes Ahead of Time:**

Please remember to sign up for PATCH classes at least 48 hours in advance, by calling your local PATCH office. This determines enrollment numbers and provides PATCH with your contact information in case the class is rescheduled/cancelled due to low enrollment or emergencies. It also gives us time to prepare materials for classes.

**Remember to sign in:** You will not receive a certificate for a training class if your name does not appear on the sign-in sheet. Please check all information on the sign-in sheet. Print clearly when correcting any errors in your name, address, or telephone number.

**Be on time:** If you arrive more than 15 minutes late, you will not be allowed to sign in. If you are unable to stay for the full duration of the training, you will not receive a training certificate. In both circumstances, your attendance will not be posted in the database for that class.

Likewise, if a trainer is more than 15 minutes late— you may assume that the class has been cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances. We will call you to reschedule the class.

**Turn off your cell phone:** As a courtesy to other participants, please turn off the volume of your cell phone or pager.

**Adults only please:** We love children, but as a courtesy to other participants, we ask that you make alternative arrangements for child care.

### **Bring your Record of Training:**

Please bring your Record of Training (available via the PATCH office) with you to each class and remember to get the instructor's signature after each class. When you have completed an entire series, return the original Record of Training to the PATCH office and we will mail you a Certificate of Completion for the series.

**Keep good records:** Whether you take a PATCH class or any other training, you should keep track of the trainings you attend for future reference. If you need verification of your PATCH classes, there is a \$2.00 fee for a computer printout list of classes taken at PATCH. If you have misplaced your Record of Training sheet, there is a \$3.00 fee for a replacement. Duplicate certificates are available for \$1.00 each. Please keep in mind that PATCH often deletes information beyond 5 years to make room for the next year.

**(7 classes)** - This series is for experienced caregivers looking to gain in-depth knowledge and strategies for working with children (ages 2-8) who have challenging behaviors.

**Quality Care Series (10 classes)** - The workshops in this new series are designed to support staff in early childhood programs as they engage in the self-assessment process for the Hawaii Preschool Content Standards incentive of the Quality Care Program. Also meets professional development for early educators.

**Puppet Series (5 classes)** - For all early childhood professionals who are interested in using puppets to build literacy skills.

**Supporting Play Series (5 classes)** - Looks at methods early childhood professionals can utilize to help children (3-5 yrs.) develop socially and cognitively through play.

**WestEd Basic Infant/Toddler Series (10 classes)** - Introductory series to working with children age 0-3 yrs. (meets I/T licensing requirements).
