Keep it simple this holiday season

Working with young children can be incredibly rewarding, but it can also be a filled with obstacles. Dealing with parental demands, conflicts in the classroom, challenging behaviors, and trying to set lesson plans during the holidays can be exhausting in a normal year, add on a global pandemic and it can become completely overwhelming. The holidays are going to look different this year, but different does not mean that it needs to be stressful.

You've probably heard the expression you can't fill from an empty cup. Most of us try to be ECE Champions and power through every hurdle like an Olympic Gold Medalist. We don't ask for help, we don't take breaks and at the end of the day we have nothing left for ourselves. Which leads me to this revelation: sometimes, you have to put yourself first so you can be a better caregiver. It isn't selfish. Even on an airplane, adults are asked to put on their oxygen masks first, and then assist children or other passengers.

As caregivers of young children, whether you are a parent, a child care provider, or both, it is hard to find time to take care of yourself. Self-care is not only necessary to stay grounded and healthy – your interactions with children is a reflection of your mood. No one wants to be yelled at all day by his or her overwhelmed caregiver. So how do you take care of yourself, especially during the holiday season? Let's start by keeping it simple, knowing your limits and not being afraid to take care of yourself.

In the classroom keep seasonal crafts and activities simple. Make it easy on yourself: focus on what is developmentally relevant rather than trying to cover every aspect, especially if you work with young kiddos or a mixed age group.

Practice breathing exercises when you feel out of control. Including the children in these exercises can teach them about self-soothing, and this might be a great chance to play and learn together. Even short breaks can reenergize you. Five minutes by yourself can be an incredible recharge! Remember to stay hydrated, eat healthy and give your mind a rest every now and then.

Other things, like targeting the reason for your stress will help you be mindful of your mood. Try to recognize the circumstances that cause you the most stress. Knowing which things stress you out most and being able to identify when stress is coming on will help you be better prepared to deal with situations. Above all, ask for help when you need it.

Remember that you cannot care for others unless you take care of yourself as well. Embracing the ideas above can help you to be a more effective childcare professional and avoid stress, burnout and negative feelings during the holiday season. When you are happy and healthy, you'll be able to genuinely enjoy the holidays with those around you.

1. Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap.











BOOKS WE LOVE TO READ

STAFFS' FAVORITE





- KEEP GOOD RECORDS! Whether you are taking PATCH classes or other training, you should keep track of the trainings that you attend for future reference
- Please keep in mind that PATCH deletes information more than 5 years old to make room for the next year. PATCH strives to coordinate its Training Program (and other programs) to fit the needs of Hawaii's child care professionals. 
